# MINUTES SELECTMEN'S MEETING GRIFFIN ROOM, TOWN HALL MONDAY, JUNE 11, 2012 7:00 P.M.

MEETING CALLED TO ORDER at 7:00 p.m. by Chairwoman Cebula.

Mr. Hughes moved approval of the Consent Agenda Items A, B, D, F, G, and H. Mr. McManus seconded the motion and the motion carried by a unanimous vote. Mr. Hughes moved Item C with the exception of Matt McCaffery to the Planning Board based on the fact that there are only 3 Selectmen here tonight and it merits the full consideration of the Board and also that we have had a number of correspondence on this topic and requested that the Interview Committee get together with Mr. McCaffery, review the correspondence and provide a report on this topic. Mr. McManus seconded the motion and the motion carried by a unanimous vote.

Mr. Hughes moved to hold Item E, because we have correspondence on this as well, ask the Interview Committee to review that correspondence with Mr. Gould and come back with a recommendation. Mr. McManus seconded the motion and the motion carried by a unanimous vote.

## PUBLIC HEARINGS/PRESENTATIONS (7:15 P.M.)

• Update from Middle School Re-Purposing Committee – *Robin Wilkins* Mr. Wilkins outlined the attached report to the Board and took questions and comments from the Board.

## **OLD BUSINESS**

• Vote to file a Home Rule Petition on Health Insurance for Elected Officials with State Representative Sarah Peake

Mr. Hughes moved to authorize the Town Administrator to sign this letter. Mr. McManus seconded the motion and the motion carried by a 2-0-1 vote with Mr. McManus abstaining from the vote.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

• Monomoy Regional School District draft lease - discussion

Mr. Merriam outlined comments offered by both Chatham and Harwich counsels and he commented that it is a typical standard lease agreement for 20 years. Chairwoman Cebula stressed that we should have a clear understanding of who will be paying for liability insurance to cover trips and falls, etc. Mr. Merriam responded that he has forwarded the comments to our insurance carrier. He added that Town Counsel has noted that the Little League field needs to be addressed as well and Chairwoman Cebula agreed. Mr. McManus stated that there are 3 different boundaries set and there are some issues that the project manager and architect are researching regarding easements with regard to utilities and fiber optic cables and once they get that settled they can make a recommendation on the boundaries. Mr. Hughes noted that the lease should address the Middle School being returned to the Town and that Section 4.3 doesn't make sense to him being in this lease. He said the comments should be incorporated into another draft for next week. Chairwoman Cebula asked the Board to get their comments back to Mr. Merriam. The Board requested to have Town Counsel present at their June 25 meeting for a lease discussion.

• Vote to disband Traffic & Safety Committee

Mr. McManus said that based on the Board's actions of creating the Public Safety group

to take over much of the Traffic & Safety Committee's responsibilities, the Interview Committee found that the Traffic & Safety Committee was formed by the Board of Selectmen and not by by-law or Charter, and as there are currently no standing members of the Committee, they recommend that it be terminated and that its responsibilities be transferred to the Public Safety group. He noted that Paul Erickson has provided a document of all of the Committee's unfinished business and this should be given to the Public Safety group as their initial work plan. Mr. McManus moved the recommendation and Mr. Hughes seconded the motion. Mr. Hughes said it would be appropriate to ask the Public Safety group to come back in 3 or 4 months with a status report and the Board agreed. Mr. Erickson pointed out that not everything on the list should go to the Public Safety group as some items need to go to the Board of Selectmen or Town Administrator. The motion carried by a unanimous vote.

• Letter from Brian Murphy regarding Crowell Barn project – *discussion* Mr. Murphy was not present. Mr. McManus stated that currently this parcel is under Board of Selectmen jurisdiction and if they are not going to be overseeing it in the future they need to decide who to make the assignment to and ask Town Meeting to make that transfer. He said that up until that time it is nominally a Board of Selectmen project and they have the ability to ask staff to help move it along. Chairwoman Cebula said it is a good list of things to be considered in the future but she is not ready to make decisions based on it at this time.

Mr. Loftus brought to the attention of the Board Article 18 of the May 1988 Annual Town Meeting which formed the Brooks Academy Museum Commission and noted that they were charged with maintaining the building and promoting and preserving the history of the Town within and on the grounds surrounding the building through Article 26 of the May 1989 Annual Town Meeting. He recommended that the Board look into it and Chairwoman Cebula agreed.

 Letter from Winnie & Richard Gundersen regarding public meetings on Allen Harbor
dredging project – *discussion/possible vote*

Richard Gundersen outlined his letter requesting the public to be involved in the process for the Allen Harbor dredging project and he asked that the Board schedule a public forum. He added that it would offer a great learning lab for the schools. Mr. Merriam noted that there is an upcoming public meeting and Mr. Gunderson responded that 9:00 a.m. is not convenient for everyone. Mr. Hughes said it should be addressed at the Non-Resident Taxpayers Meeting as well and the plan should be presented at that time. He also recommended a one page handout about the project which could be available in the Board of Selectmen's office as well as at the meeting. Mr. McManus noted that a hearing is not required but there is nothing preventing them from having one and he noted that there was a public forum held for the Route 137 project. Mr. Merriam stated that advertising is fine under the law for this project. Ms. Cebula stressed that they don't want to limit public information and access and she asked Mr. Merriam to come up with a practice for the Board to consider putting in place.

#### Comparison of Trucking Costs from Lincoln Hooper

Per your requests I~am emailing you~spreadsheets~of hauling expenses~associated with SeMass (MSW - Rochester) and New Bedford Waste Services (C&D - Sandwich).~ Although I think the numbers in the spreadsheets speak for themselves, I feel~it would be remiss if I did not elaborate~on a few issues.~ First and foremost, I think we have~one of the best, neatest, cleanest, efficiently run disposal areas~around.~ I am extremely proud of what was accomplished~during the~13~years I was on staff there and how the current staff has perpetuated the operation since~then.~ Not only do~we provide what I consider to be the best customer service for both residents and businesses alike, but we do so with less staff than our neighboring towns, while~hauling all~materials in-house unlike most of our surrounding communities.~ Two primary reasons for this are: dedicated and motivated staff that have taken ownership of the the operation and the fact that~every staff member can perform~all needed functions at the~Disposal Area.~~With this in mind, I would like to provide some bullets~of items that~separate us from other communities and make us more efficient:~

- When drivers return from runs, they move on to the next task (another load, operating loader, turning compost, C&D processing, recycling, maintenance, etc.) as~employees are cross trained to perform all functions.
- We utilize ejector trailers that are significantly cheaper than live floors, last longer and are much faster.~ However, they require~the truck to carry 85 gal of hydraulic oil and a 3~line wet system.~~I~have seen~few trucks in the private sector~configured in this fashion.~~
- We only have 3 MSW trailers and 2 C&D trailers.~ This is less than half the number of trailers other communities that outsource the hauling function have (MSW Dennis -~8 trailers, Brewster -~5 trailers, Chatham 4). We are able to have less trailers because we operate like a just-in-time inventory...I.e. as soon as they are full, they are hauled.~~
- Numerous companies have attempted to get our C&D business in the past.~~Although the ownership of the company we haul to in Sandwich has changed several~times over the years, they have maintained~a constant~price of \$75 / ton delivered to their facility and never charge us additional fees for mixed loads or other materials.~ Other companies we have tried with test loads either

don't want our material (not clean enough) or charge us extra for handling.~ For reference, the County bid for hauling and disposing of C&D for Dennis is \$93 / ton.~ We do it for approximately \$80 / ton, or \$58k per year cheaper (~\$13/ton savings x 4500 tons = \$58,500).~~ I am unaware of any other communities that utilize 100 yd open top trailers to haul C&D in as most use 40 yd rolloff containers.~ The combination of using 100 yd trailers and crushing the material with our old compactor allows us to get approximately 18 tons per load (extremely efficient). ~

When hauling recycling loads in rolloff containers, we do so~two at a time (doubles).~ Although this is an industry standard now, I am unaware of any of our neighboring communities that do so (most of them haul recycling internally one at a time).~ The purchase of the pup trailer several years ago effectively cut our trips in half, reducing~labor, fuel, mileage, etc. by~about 40%.~ For the record,~my FY 13 sticker analysis used \$170,000 in recycling revenue to help offset residential sticker costs.~

It was not my intent to~write a dissertation here with regard to your request for trucking information.~ However, I am~extremely proud of the Disposal Area and pride myself on providing~its customers with a high~quality, cost efficient service.~~With the complexities of that operation, it is difficult to convey its efficiency and effectiveness in a spreadsheet or~short email.~ I'd be happy to~discuss~any of this with you at your convenience.
