Vice Chair Thompson called the meeting to order 11:00 a.m.

Commissioner Underwood motioned to accept the Minutes as written. Clerk Donahue seconded the motion. All in favor; 4-0-0.

ABATEMENTS

Commissioner Underwood motioned to reject the abatement request. Commissioner Gough seconded the motion. All in favor; 4-0-0.

NEW BUSINESS

A. Water Department Capital Plan

Superintendent Pelletier provided the Board with an overview of the Water Department's Capital Plan.

B. Wastewater Update

Superintendent Pelletier provided an update on Wastewater.

Superintendent Pelletier has called Barnstable County a couple of times to discuss the Barnstable County Septic Loan Program but has not heard back from them yet. Harwich did appropriate \$100,000 for the purpose of lowering the interest rate from 5% to 2%.

The earliest the sewer "Order to Connect" letters would go out would be the last week in August. Chatham has proposed language change for the IMA amendments. The IMA working

group needs to reconvene to bless those changes before the changes are brought back to the individual Board's of Selectmen.

The training for the Wastewater Pump Stations is taking place this week along with Generator training.

Clerk Donahue hopes that the Town can start talking about Wastewater as the whole project and not just about D.H.Y. (Dennis, Harwich, Yarmouth) agreement.

Superintendent Pelletier has asked GHD to prepare a scope based on what conversations between Superintendent Pelletier and GHD have been, based on what MEPA (Massachusetts Environmental Policy Act) recommends be done, in order to revise what needs to be revised in the CWMP. Right now, the town doesn't have money appropriated to pay GHD for services related to CWMP revisions. Superintendent Pelletier has asked GHD to come to the dedicated Wastewater meeting to discuss CWMP revisions in hopes the BOS will put through an an article for fall town meeting to fund that scope of work so those discussions can take place.

The Pleasant Bay Alliance report will touch upon the new modeling results from the breach in Muddy Creek which is going to inform attenuation rates that could suggest change towards the wastewater management plan in East Harwich that could impact how we decide to do D.H.Y. or another phase in Town.

C. Pleasant Lake Tank Project

Contractors are wrapping up a couple punch list items. Our Harwich Water Department crew has also brought the 24" water main pipe all the way over to the woods area where the final connection will be made this fall.

Once the Department receives pricing from the Waterworks Bid on the 10th the Department will be looking to purchase some water main pipe to connect the tank into the Oak Street main down towards Long Pond Drive.

D. Chatham Road Land Acquisition

KP Law recommended to have the Owners Unknown parcels out back on Chatham Road surveyed and plans developed. Once the parcels are surveyed, the next step can be taken.

CORRESPONDENCE

Resident Francis Pugsley submitted a nice Thank You note to the employees of the Water Department.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

The well drillers and GZA were out on-site at Well 10 to lay out the locations of the test wells. In September they will do the first round of drilling.

Last week was the kick-off meeting with GHD for the Route 28 water main replacement design.

Union negotiations with IAMAW will begin tomorrow afternoon.

Superintendent Pelletier has heard back from the County regarding the Barnstable County Septic Loan program. Superintendent Pelletier relayed to them that Harwich had appropriated a sum of money to help bring those loans in at a lower interest rate. They relayed that we may not need to since they have requested money from the State for the Clean Water Trust. There should be an update in the next week or so.

CALL TO ORDER

Chair Carreiro called the regular session meeting to order 11:20 a.m.

Executive session ran from 11:00 a.m. to 11:18 a.m. Contract negotiations were discussed. No decisions were made. The executive session minutes of February 11, 2021 were approved.

CONSENT AGENDA

The Minutes of July 29, 2021 and August 11, 2021 will be added to the next agenda.

OLD/UNFINISHED BUSINESS

A. Wastewater Update

Superintendent Pelletier provided an update on wastewater.

Superintendent Pelletier did the substantial completion walk-through for construction contract #1 with Robert Our Company and everything looked in order. A recommendation to approve the substantial completion will be coming from CDM Smith to the Town within the next couple of weeks with a final completion to follow.

The Board of Health is working on a sewer connection mandate. A public hearing will take place on September 27, 2021. The mandate will make people eligible for the sewer connection tax credit. This is not true for new construction, those who are already under an existing mandate and non-residents.

Barnstable County Septic Loan program relayed that it is highly likely that loans will be offered at 2%. Harwich has appropriated \$100,000 to offset the administrative costs.

Superintendent Pelletier commented on procuring sewer grinder pumps so that sewer customers could purchase them right from the Department.

Clerk Donahue brought up the CWMP revision and the timing of the phases. Superintendent Pelletier relayed that the CWMP did not take into account the Town's debt and that smaller frequent sewer projects make it easier to adapt. The pricing and timing of the phases are part of the scope of work included in the SewerCAD model that GHD is working on.

Superintendent Pelletier discussed attenuation rates with the Board.

Selectman MacAskill confirmed that the Wastewater Investment/Infrastructure Fund (WIIF) is separate from the Wastewater Stabilization Fund.

NEW BUSINESS

A. FY22 Free Cash Certification

Free cash was certified for the water retained earnings in the amount of \$1,603,029 for FY22.

B. Upcoming Water Department Projects

Superintendent Pelletier provided an overview of upcoming Water Department projects.

The Water Department will be looking to finish the 24" water main over at the Pleasant Lake tank and also looking to extend the water main in the other direction from the Pleasant Lake tank to the main on Oak Street going out towards Long Pond Dr.

The water bottle filling stations have been received and will be mounted soon. They will be placed at the locations of Red River Beach, Brooks Park, Chamber of Commerce and across from Pleasant Lake General Store in the area near the bike path.

Water Department crew has several cut and caps to perform.

Water Department crew will also be rebuilding the retaining wall out behind the Water Department.

Superintendent Pelletier would like to have fiber optic run from the Water Department out to the Route 39 tank.

The covert on Lothrop Ave will need to be dug up and repaired.

The backwash lagoons at the water treatment plants, particularly the Bruce Cahoon plant will need to be excavated and the top layer of sand will need to be replaced.

C. Drought Status

The Massachusetts drought task force will meet on September 8th, 2021. Superintendent Pelletier will look forward to seeing what is decided after their meeting. It is important that we maintain water restrictions. Chair Carreiro commented that flashing signs may receive better feedback.

D. FY23 Budget & Capital Project Priorities

Superintendent Pelletier provided the Board with an overview on the FY23 Budget and Capital Project priorities.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Superintendent Pelletier updated the Board that GZA well exploration will be out September 20th to start drilling exploration. The locations have been cited and are cleared for drilling.

Work has been done to update the Department's Emergency Response plan which is part of America's Water Infrastructure Act of 2018 which is required to be certified by December 31, 2021 of this year.

Superintendent Pelletier started working on generator procurement for 196 Chatham Rd and Station #8.

The Department did not get chosen for the Coastal Resiliency Grant.

Superintendent Pelletier would like to coordinate with the Harbormaster so that we can inspect the hangars and pipes underneath all of the bridge crossings. He would also like to investigate the integrity of the mains that cross under Route 6.

Dear Mr. Customer,

With municipal sewer service now available at your property, the Water & Wastewater Department has prepared this welcome package with information on how to connect, the Do's and Don'ts of sewer, and other information to consider as you plan your connection.

In an effort to familiarize you with the process, we have provided a "Sewer Connection Checklist" located on the back side of this letter. From design drawings to selecting a contractor to perform the work, it is recommended that you obtain multiple quotes. You may also wish to consider requesting quotes jointly with a neighbor as a designer and/or installer may offer more competitive pricing if the work is quoted together.

Your cost to design and install the sewer service connection is the responsibility of the owner, however, there are various programs that you may be eligible for. Massachusetts currently offers a septic system tax credit that is available to owner-occupied primary residences, connecting to a municipal sewer system. A tax professional could further provide you with more information on eligibility. Barnstable County Septic Loan Program is another program that is available to Harwich residents. This program can be used for both design and construction costs and is currently being offered at a very low interest rate repayable over a maximum of a 20-year repayment term.

As stated in the "Order to Connect" letter, property owners will have 2-years from the date of this mailing to design and install their sewer service. Property owners experiencing financial or other hardships may apply for an extension with the Board of Health who will review extension requests on a case-by-case basis.

After the sewer service has been installed, property owners will begin to receive quarterly sewer bills based upon the volume of water that passes through the water meter. Properties having an irrigation system or history of excessive outdoor water use may want to consider installing an irrigation/sewer deduct meter. A deduct meter is intended to separately measure outdoor water usage so it can be deducted when generating the sewer bills. The deduct meter is installed after the domestic water meter on your private plumbing and must be installed by a licensed plumber. The cost of the meter and its installation is the responsibility of the property owner. For further information, please refer to our Irrigation/Sewer Deduct Meter Policy located on the Department's website.

We hope this package will provide you with the information and resources to make your sewer connection easy and efficient, and as always please do not hesitate to contact us should you need any additional assistance.

VOTING PROCEDURES

- I A quorum, 150 registered voters, must be present in order to conduct business. The only motion in order when no quorum is present is a motion to adjourn.
- II A two-thirds majority of the Town Meeting shall be required for inclusion of any Capital Outlay, unless it was included in the Capital Outlay Plan adopted at the preceding Town Meeting.
- III All motions introduced at the Town Meeting shall be in writing when required by the Moderator.
- IV Voters are limited to two times speaking on any one question; the total time speaking not to exceed 10 minutes.
- V Only registered voters shall occupy the meeting "floor".
- VI No voter will be allowed to speak until he or she is recognized by the Moderator.
- VII Motion requiring more than a simple majority to pass:
 - A. To reconsider a vote on a motion $-\frac{3}{4}$ majority (this motion must be made prior to the next adjournment of the meeting).

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MUNICIPAL FINANCE TERMS

<u>APPROPRIATION</u>: An authorization granted by a town meeting, city council or other legislative body to expend money and incur obligations for specific public purposes. An appropriation is usually limited in amount and as to the time period within which it may be expended.

<u>AVAILABLE FUNDS</u>: Balances in the various fund types that represent nonrecurring revenue sources. As a matter of sound practice, they are frequently appropriated for unforeseen expenses, capital expenditures, or other one-time costs. Examples of available funds include free cash, stabilization funds, overlay surplus, water surplus, and retained earnings.

<u>CHERRY SHEET</u>: Named for the cherry-colored paper on which they were originally printed, the Cherry Sheet is the official notification to cities, towns, and regional school districts of the next fiscal year's state aid and assessments. The aid is in the form of distributions, which provide funds based on formulas and reimbursements that provide funds for costs incurred during a prior period for certain programs or services.

<u>FREE CASH</u>: Remaining, unrestricted funds from operations of the previous fiscal year, including unexpended free cash from the previous year, actual receipts in excess of revenue estimated on the tax recapitulation sheet, and unspent amounts in budget line items. Unpaid property taxes and certain deficits reduce the amount that can be certified as free cash.

OVERLAY (Overlay Reserve, or Allowance for Abatements and Exemptions): An account that funds anticipated property tax abatements, exemptions, and uncollected taxes. Additions to the overlay reserve need not be funded by the normal appropriation process but instead raised on the tax rate recapitulation sheet.

<u>RESERVE FUND</u>: An amount (not to exceed 5 percent of the tax levy for the preceding year) set aside annually within a community's budget to provide a funding source for extraordinary or unforeseen expenditures. In a town, the finance committee can authorize transfers from this fund for "extraordinary or unforeseen" expenditures. Other uses of the fund require budgetary transfers by town meeting.

STABILIZATION FUND: A fund designed to accumulate amounts for capital and other future spending purposes, although it may be appropriated for any lawful purpose (MGL c. 40 § 5B). Communities may establish one or more stabilization funds for different purposes and may appropriate any amounts into them. A two-thirds vote of town meeting is required to establish, amend the purpose of, or appropriate money from a stabilization fund. A majority vote of town meeting is required to appropriate money into a stabilization fund.

MUNICIPAL FINANCE TERMS RELATED TO CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS

<u>CAPITAL ASSETS:</u> – Any tangible property used in the operation of government that is not easily converted into cash and that has an initial useful life extending beyond a single financial reporting period. Capital assets include land and land improvements; infrastructure, such as roads, bridges, water and sewer lines; easements; buildings and building improvements; vehicles, machinery and equipment. Communities typically define capital assets in terms of a minimum useful life and minimum initial cost.

<u>CAPITAL BUDGET:</u> An appropriation or spending plan that uses borrowing or direct outlay for capital or fixed asset improvements. Among other information, a capital budget should identify the method to finance each recommended expenditure (e.g., tax levy or rates) and identify those items that were not recommended.

<u>CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS PROGRAM:</u> – A blueprint for planning a community's capital expenditures that comprises an annual capital budget and a five-year capital plan. It coordinates community planning, fiscal capacity, and physical development. While all the community's needs should be identified in the program, there is a set of criteria that prioritize the expenditures.

<u>CAPITAL OUTLAY:</u> The exchange of one asset (cash) for another (capital asset) with no ultimate effect on net assets. Also known as "pay as you go," it is the appropriation and use of available cash to fund a capital improvement, as opposed to incurring debt to cover the cost.

<u>FIXED ASSETS:</u> – Long-lived, tangible assets, such as buildings, equipment and land, obtained or controlled as a result of past transactions or circumstances.

MUNICIPAL FINANCE TERMS RELATED TO PROPOSITION 2 ½ TERMS

Chapter 59, Section 21C of the Massachusetts General Laws commonly referred to as Proposition 2 ½ (Prop. 2 ½) or the Tax Limiting Law for Cities and Towns in Massachusetts.

<u>CAPITAL OUTLAY EXPENDITURE EXCLUSION</u>: A temporary increase in the tax levy to fund a capital project or to make a capital acquisition. Such an exclusion requires a two-thirds vote of the selectmen or city council (sometimes with the mayor's approval) and a majority vote in a communitywide referendum. The exclusion is added to the tax levy only during the year in which the project is being funded and may increase the tax levy above the levy ceiling.

<u>CONTINGENT APPROPRIATION</u>: An appropriation that authorizes spending for a particular purpose only if subsequently approved in a voter referendum. Under MGL c. 59 § 21C (m), towns may make appropriations from the tax levy, available funds, or borrowing contingent on the subsequent passage of a Proposition $2^{1}/_{2}$ override or exclusion question for the same purpose. If initially approved at an annual town meeting, voter approval of the contingent appropriation must occur by September 15. Otherwise, the referendum vote must occur within 90 days after the town meeting dissolves. The question may be placed before the voters at more than one election, but if the appropriation is not approved by the applicable deadline, it is null and void. If contingent appropriations are funded through

property taxes, DLS cannot approve the tax rate until the related override or exclusion question is resolved or the deadline passes, whichever occurs first.

<u>DEBT EXCLUSION</u>: An action taken by a community through a referendum vote to raise the funds necessary to pay debt service costs for a particular project from the property tax levy but outside of the limits under Proposition $2^{1}/_{2}$. By approving a debt exclusion, a community calculates its annual levy limit under Proposition $2^{1}/_{2}$, then adds the excluded debt service cost. The amount is added to the levy limit for the life of the debt only and may increase the levy above the levy ceiling.

<u>LEVY</u>: The amount a community raises through the property tax. The levy can be any amount up to the levy limit, which is reestablished every year in accordance with Proposition $2^{1}/_{2}$ provisions.

<u>LEVY CEILING</u>: – A levy ceiling is one of two types of levy (tax) restrictions imposed by MGL c. 59 § 21C (Proposition $2^{1}/_{2}$). It states that, in any year, the real and personal property taxes imposed may not exceed $2^{1}/_{2}$ percent of the total full and fair cash value of all taxable property. Property taxes levied may exceed this limit only if the community passes a capital exclusion, debt exclusion, or special exclusion.

<u>LEVY LIMIT</u>: A levy limit is one of two types of levy (tax) restrictions imposed by MGL c. 59 § 21C (Proposition $2^{1}/_{2}$). It states that the real and personal property taxes imposed by a city or town may only grow each year by $2^{1}/_{2}$ percent of the prior year's levy

<u>NEW GROWTH</u>: The additional tax revenue generated by new construction, renovations and other increases in the property tax base during a calendar year. It does not include value increases caused by normal market forces or revaluations.

OVERRIDE: A vote by a community at an election to permanently increase the levy limit. An override vote may increase the levy limit no higher than the levy ceiling. The override question on the election ballot must state a purpose for the override and the dollar amount.

OVERRIDE CAPACITY: The difference between a community's levy ceiling and its levy limit. It is the maximum amount by which a community may override its levy limit.


