I'm helping to clean out my parents' home in Harwich. For over 40 years my dad (a local eccentric, recently deceased) had a headstone in his garden. He moved it from house to house when he moved. I believe a local builder gave it to him but I don't really know the full story of where it came from. It's a real headstone though.

The obvious question for me is -- what can I do to find an appropriate home for this headstone? I'd like to do the "right" thing but I'm not at all sure what that would be. The name on the stone is Heman Foster, died 5/12/1882. See attached image.

Hi Robbin,

Thanks so much for talking to me about this. My dad lived in Harwich from 1970 on. He spent summers on the Cape as a boy and he had old friends in town in the trades. I think someone gave him the headstone in 1974 or so. I always assumed it came from Harwich but that was just an assumption (I was only 8 at the time so I didn't get the details). I figured it was a local excavator, like Bobby Our or someone similar, and I suppose it could have been from any of the surrounding towns or maybe from off-Cape somewhere.

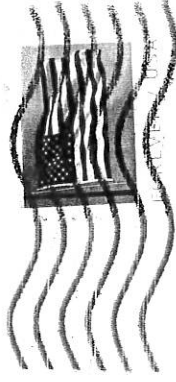

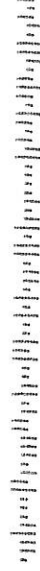

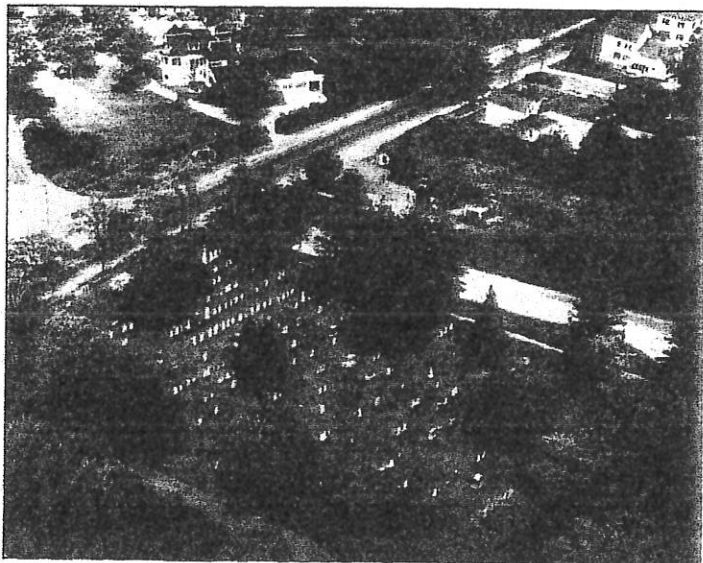

In this issue Post Scripts presents with pleasure a feature on the Sagamore cemetery researched, written, and supplied with photos by Donald E. ("Jerry") and M. Elizabeth ("Beth") Ellis. Mr. Ellis is a Bourne native, a member of the Bourne Historical Society and the Bourne Historic Commission. Mrs. Ellis is a member of the Bourne Society for Historic Preservation. She is Reference Librarian at the Sandwich Public Library.

Sagamore Cemetery: Not Just A Grave Subject!

From ancient times to the present, in primitive to highly civilized cultures, people have developed rites and rituals for the burial of their dead. The structure and contents of the Egyptian pyramids, resting places of royal bones (or, more precisely, mummified corpses) reveal much about the society in that part of the world thousands of years ago. It is almost solely from scholarly study of tombs, such as the impressive example at Newgrange, Ireland, that we are able to glean any knowledge of the life of our ancestors during the Neolithic Age (c. 3700–2000 B.C.). The first record of a burial ground appears in Genesis, where Abraham purchased land suitable for the burial of his wife, Sarah, and subsequent family members.

Likewise, the dozens of old cemeteries on Cape Cod yield a treasure trove of information—social, medical, religious, and economic—about life here during several previous centuries. Folk art and verse, often standardized but occasionally original, abound on the stone markers. The Sagamore Ceme-

tery has become a repository of part of the history of this small village. We will attempt to extract bits of this history as recorded in numerous sources and noted or inferred from careful observation of grave-stones here.

Earliest records of the Sagamore Cemetery have been lost but tradition

has it that the land for the original cemetery was given by Elisha Burgess around 1800. Subsequent donors of abutting parcels were Hiram Crowell, Benjamin B. Abbe, Isaac N. Keith, and Hiram E. Crowell. The cemetery was incorporated in 1889.

The earliest marked graves in the "original" cemetery are of brothers: Alvin Gibbs (died 1810 at age 16) and Barnabas Gibbs (died 1812 at age 24). An even older stone, moved from the Collins farm private cemetery in Bournedale, is for a child: Tempy Bourne, who died in 1803 at the age of "2 years, 8 months, 16 days." (Can we conclude from this sad recording that EVERY DAY of life was thought precious in "the old days"?)

There are memorials here to no fewer than 29 sea captains. We purposely cannot say that 29 sea captains are buried here as the notation on about a third of their stones—"lost at sea"—is a somber reminder to us that careers on the sea encompassed more than the romance of visiting faraway places.

"Lost at sea" is, more often than not, a euphemism for "drowned."

In this cemetery, perhaps the saddest testament to the perils of life at sea is on the stone of Paul Crowell. All four of the sons of Paul and Sally Crowell were "lost at sea": two in June, 1825, and two in March, 1840. At their deaths they ranged in age from 16 to 27 years old. One, Prince, was a captain.

Burgess Monument

The cemetery's most notable monument is the obelisk marking the graves of Capt. William Burgess and his wife, Hannah Rebecca Burgess. The poem she composed to her husband's memory and which she had inscribed on his monument is one of the longest treatises to be found on any gravestone on the Cape. It is also one of the most romantic and touching.

Thou are gone—in vain I seek thee
Thou hast passed from earth away
And the brooding wing of sorrow
Lies darkly o'er my way.
For I miss thy gentle presence
Thy guiding hand I miss,
Thy pleasant, social converse
Thy beaming truthful face.

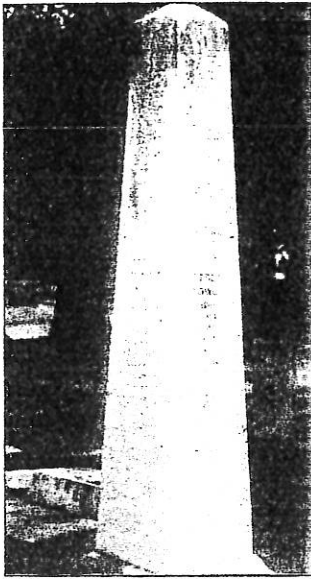
Oh! I have loved too fondly
And a gracious Father's hand
Hath removed my cherished idol
To a brighter better land.
But this last hope is left me
To cheer my stricken heart,
In that blest world to meet thee
And never, never part.

As is well-known, Rebecca navigated her husband's ship *Challenger* to safe harbor in Valparaiso, Chile, when he died unexpectedly

aboard ship in 1856 at the age of 27, leaving behind a 22-year-old bride of just four years.

Veterans and Other Notables

Buried here, too, are veterans of every major war (except, possibly, the Spanish-American War): Revolutionary War, 2; War of 1812, 4; Civil War, 20; World War I, 14; World War II, 21; Korean War, 6; Vietnam War, 2. There is even one who served in the Mexican Border War.

Stillman Ellis is buried here. His claim to fame is that he was—briefly—mistaken for John Wilkes Booth! He was on a ship captained by Russell Gibbs (also of Sagamore and buried here) when it encountered a blockade on the Potomac River and was boarded by a U.S. Navy boarding party. Capt. Gibbs was told that President

Lincoln had been shot the night before and that his assassin was believed to be on a ship in the vicinity. When the crew lined up for scrutiny, the officer pointed to Stillman Ellis, saying "This is Booth." Thinking quickly, Capt. Gibbs suggested that the officer inspect Ellis's hands. When he did so, he found them indeed to be the hardened and callused hands of a sailor, not those of an actor.

Noble P. Swift, son of the founder of the Swift Meat Packing Co., is buried here as is his uncle, Levi Swift, a co-founder.

Sagamore Cemetery is the final resting place of Nathan Nye, captain of a whaling ship early in his career. He went on to become the Town of Bourne's first treasurer and tax collector and, later, selectman (1887-1893). Five subsequent Bourne selectmen are buried here.

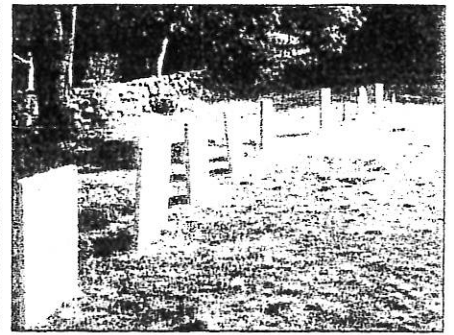
Ralph Small, Bourne tax collector from 1930 to 1952, is remembered by many for his insistence on riding his gigantic red horse to work from Sagamore all during World War II. A stable was made at the rear of Town Hall to accommodate his transportation whim!

The founder of the Keith Car Works, his sons, the last local owner of the family business (Eben S.S. Keith), and other members of this prominent family are buried in the Sagamore Cemetery, many in the only tomb here. Employing approximately 1200 workers at its peak, the Keith Car and Manufacturing Company gave Sagamore much of its identity during the period 1867 to 1928. For a contemporary perspective on the economic importance of this Sagamore business, note that today's largest employer on Cape Cod, Cape Cod Hospital, also has about 1200 people on its staff.

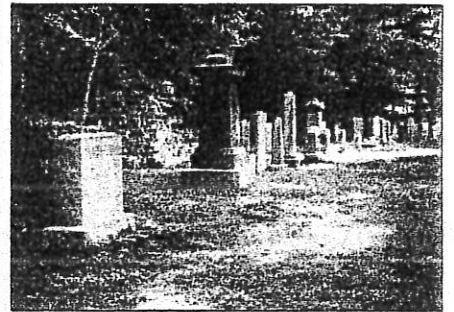
There is also a Charles Manson buried here!

Most Interesting Section— Moved Here!

One of the most interesting areas of the Sagamore Cemetery is in the rear, to the left. Here were re-interred the remains from two private ceme-

teries in Bournedale which stood in the path of the proposed Cape Cod Canal. Capt. Elisha Bourne, grandfather of Jonathan Bourne, Jr. (for whom our town is named), is buried here as is Elisha's son, Jonathan Bourne, Sr. It is a bit ironic that Elisha was banished during the Revolutionary War as a Tory. His citizenship was restored in 1788 by an act of the legislature. Altogether, 17 members of the early Bourne family—excepting the town's namesake—are buried here in what we hope will be their final resting place.

About 45 bodies from the old Ellis Cemetery in Bournedale were moved to the Sagamore Cemetery, mostly in 1909, over the protests of Emory Ellis, then the remaining local owner and caretaker. An article in the July 25, 1909, edition of the *Boston Sunday Post* called Ellis "an obstinate and determined Cape Codder whose refusal to permit the removal of his departed ancestors . . . to a strange cemetery has brought about a crisis in the building of the Cape Cod Canal." Did we ever doubt that big government would prevail in this battle over a solitary and valiant Cape Codder who, too, is now buried in the "strange" cemetery at Sagamore?



This motif has been called an "emblem of God" but it looks to us like a directional!

Grace Swift Nye

Few realize that a very recent "notable," Grace Swift Nye, is buried in the Sagamore Cemetery. She will be revered forever, we trust, for her generosity in bequeathing millions for the benefit of students in Bourne, Sandwich, Wareham, and Plymouth. The family fortune had its roots nearby in Sagamore at the Nye Lumber Company, once situated off Freighthouse Road.

Art in the Park Cemetery

The weeping willow, a common motif applied to old gravestones, appears on numerous Sagamore markers. Not surprisingly, an anchor adorns several others including that of Capt. Eben Nickerson (d. Talcahuano, South America, 1861). His passing also merited a verse with a nautical theme:

In the bright waters now thy anchor's cast;
Beloved Husband, Father dear: thy bark hast passed
The rough sea's foam.
Now the long yearnings of thy soul are stilled.

Expectant parents have been known to stroll the old cemeteries in search of staunch, romantic, or old-fashioned names. But we doubt that some that we noticed on stones will soon enjoy a revival: Zenas, Sophronia, Hepsah!

Still privately owned and operated, the Sagamore Cemetery struggles to have enough income to assure maintenance and improvements. Directors

encourage people to remember the Sagamore Cemetery with a bequest, following the example (among others) of one of the cemetery's most renowned residents, Hannah Rebecca Burgess. □

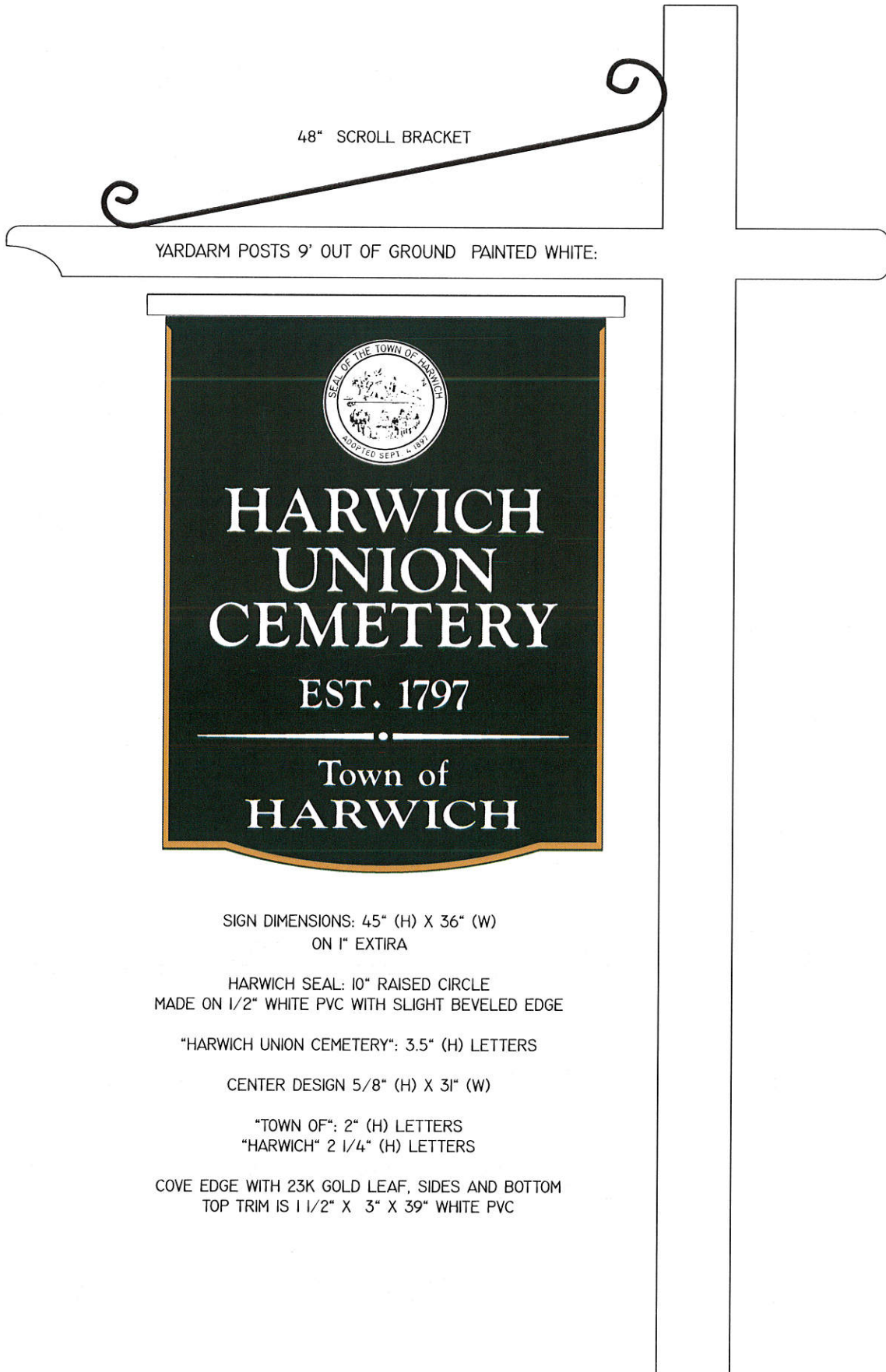

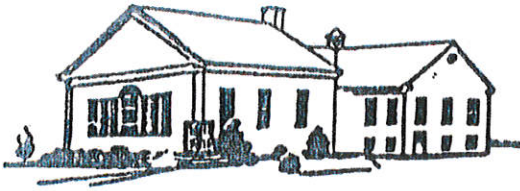

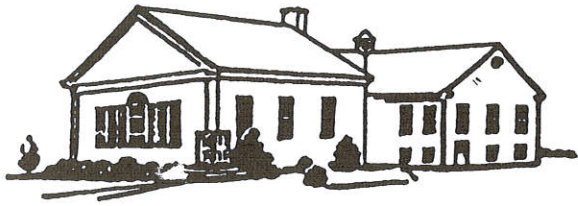

RE: Union Cemetery Gravestone Project

The Harwich Church congregation is concerned about the condition of the cemetery next to the church. We were disappointed that the town was not able to vote to refurbish the cemetery stones this year. Every year that funds are withheld for repairs more valuable information is being lost to the weather. Currently many stones are almost impossible to read. A number of them, are cracked and loose and some could fall and cause injury. Some have been placed on the ground to avoid this from happening and the stones are now becoming buried and lost.

The cemetery grave sights host many sea captains, a Revolution Veteran, a Civil War Private that served in Company A, 58th Regiment, Massachusetts, Volunteers and died in the Battle of the Wilderness.

The members of the church understand that the cemetery is not town property. But have been informed that at the 1949 Town Meeting, Article 60: To see if the Town will vote to accept Chapter 227 of the Acts of General Courts for 1948, as amended certain cemetery associations in the Town of Harwich, and to act fully thereon, "Hereafter to hold and maintain, but for cemetery purposes only." It was moved by Oscar J. Cahoon, and duly seconded that: The Town vote to accept the provision of Chapter 227 of the Acts of the General Courts of 1948, This motion was carried without opposition. Which in sort turned over to the Town of Harwich all the maintenances of the cemeteries in town. After passage the town has been maintaining this cemetery to the present. To the church this means that the Town of Harwich already has the right to come onto our property mow, maintain, refurbish the gravestones and whatever else is needed to be done to keep the cemetery safe and clean. To clear up any doubts this letter is from the same members giving the Harwich Cemetery Commission and or Robbin Kelley the right to contact a business that has the proper knowledge and experience in restoring cemetery gravestones to do so.

This is also to let you know that even though this has been a closed cemetery for burials that we still get visitors, some even leave flowers and put flags on veterans, gravestones. Please reconsider the importance of this project and that the longer it is delayed the more it will cost the town in the future. Please vote in favor of preserving these historical memorial stones.

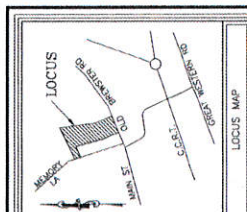
AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF HARQUICH TO ACQUIRE CERTAIN.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same as follows:

SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the town of Harwich, acting by and through its board of selectmen, may acquire by gift, conveyance, purchase or eminent domain a certain unnumbered parcel of land adjoining Kelley Cemetery in the town for cemetery purposes. The parcel is shown on Assessor's Map No. 48 as parcel T1-3.M

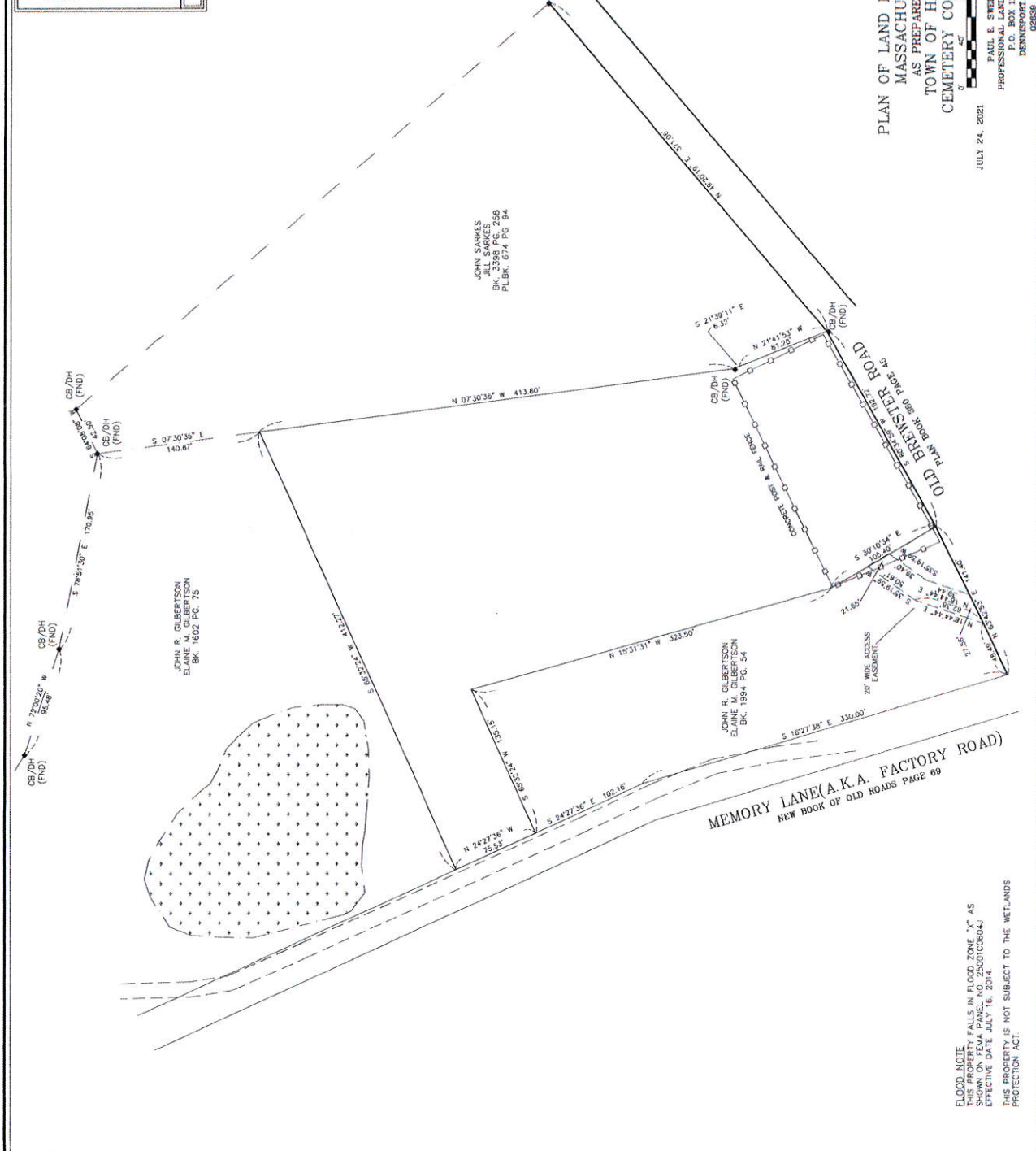

THE COMMONWEALTH OF MASSACHUSETTS

In the Year Two Thousand and Eight
