Mr. Solorzano,

On August 28, 2023 you checked into the Harwich Harbormaster office to inform me that you had purchased the 43' Matthews named Papillon from Boat Angels, a charity organization. You were notified by me at the time that you would be required to pay dockage while the boat was in the marina. Knowing that you would incur costs to get the engines running, I informed you that I would charge you the reduced fall daily rate of \$1.60 per foot instead of the summer season daily rate of \$3.20 per foot. After numerous requests for payment of your dockage charges over the last few weeks, you have failed to make a single payment to date.

Since you have disregarded my numerous attempts to collect the dockage charges that you owe, I hereby direct you to remove your vessel Papillon from Saquatucket Marina no later than Friday, October 6, 2023. If you fail to remove your vessel as directed, you will be in violation of Massachusetts General Law (MGL) Chapter 102, Section 21 and subject to a \$50.00 citation for each day that your boat remains in the harbor.

Per MGL Chapter 102, Section 24, you will also be responsible to pay all costs associated with the boat's removal from the harbor and subsequent storage if you fail to remove the boat by Friday, October 6, 2023 as directed. In addition, you will be responsible for all costs associated with its destruction if required, such as removal of fuel, removal of engines, etc., and you remain responsible for paying your outstanding dockage charges to date (invoice attached).

I again request that you take immediate action to remove your boat from the marina. If you have any questions, you can contact the Harbormaster Department office at (508) 430-7532.
