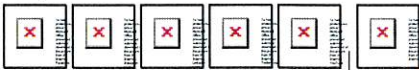

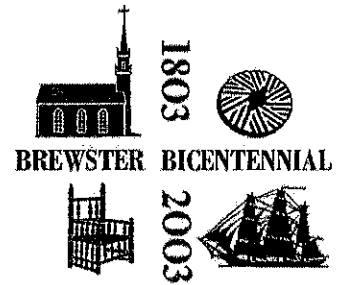

1. **Project Description:** Describe the proposed project. Is this part of a larger project or an ongoing project?

To honor the commitment and sacrifice made for freedom of our Soldiers and Sailors who served in the American Revolutionary War. We are creating a Memorial for the 284 soldiers of the Harwich and the North Precinct, now Brewster. This will be the first memorial dedicated exclusively to the Harwich Patriots of the American Revolution. It will be comprised of several granite pillars, located at Evergreen Cemetery in East Harwich, in place by 2025 as the 250th celebration begins. Evergreen Cemetery has Harwich Veterans Memorial Park. We have center circle with American Flag surround by six branches of the military. The memorial will be placed in the Walk of Remembrance. The Town of Harwich will be adding

I have attached a letter from Brewster Historical Society. I have emailed the Brewster Historical Commission and have requested to be at the next meeting so that I can present to them and they can review my application.

3. **CPA Goals/Criteria:** Describe how this project accomplishes the goals and objectives of the CPA and the Town of Brewster Community Preservation Plan FY23-27 (refer to the attached general and issue-specific criteria and identify which of these apply to the project).

The project will preserve & protect historical resources of Harwich and North Precinct now Brewster. It supports federal, state & local historic preservation priorities. This memorial will be added to the Cultural Heritage for both the towns of Harwich, Brewster, and Cape Cod. Many of the residents are unaware of the sacrifice that the founding fathers of our Towns have made. We are hoping to educate not only the children but all visitors of the importance that these soldiers.

4. Community Benefits: What are the community benefits of the project?

It preserves our American Revolution Patriots and commemorates a historic resource; it has been determined by the Brewster Preservation Committee to be significant to the history and culture of Brewster. Over 50 Massachusetts municipalities have received CPA funds to erect or preserve veteran monuments. Members of the Harwich Cemetery Commission and Harwich Cemetery Administrator have been researching all the Harwich Veterans to make sure that all their graves have been marked with Revolutionary War flag holders. While doing research we have found many do not have marked graves at all and never returned home. This memorial will be a tribute to all our soldiers.

5. Community Support: What is the nature and level of support for this project? Include letters of support and any petitions.

Harwich Cemetery Commission approved on 26 September 2022 meeting. Harwich Historical Commission approved on 19 October 2022 meeting. Letter of Support Department of Veterans Services 3 October 2022, from Shawney Carroll, USAFR (Ret) Assistant Director, Veterans Services Barnstable District. Harwich Community Preservation Committee 9 February 2023 voted to put forward for Town Meeting May 2023. Voted at May 2023 Annual Town Meeting Article #28 to fully support War Memorials \$256,282. Brewster Historical Society on 16 July 2023 at meeting of the Board of the Brewster Historical Society.

6. Timeline: What is the schedule for project implementation, including a timeline for all milestones? Please identify any special timing considerations for the project's implementation. If this is part of a larger project, is it phased? What is the timeline for the entire project?

Once the project has been procured and under contract, we will send a complete list of names for the inscriptions, names will need to be verified, spelling checked. The process once under contract should take about 9 months until memorials are in place. We would like to have an installation before the 250th Anniversary of the Revolutionary War in 2025.

7. Credentials: What are the qualifications and relevant experience of those undertaking the project?

Robbin Kelley, Cemetery Administrator, has worked for the Town of Harwich for 20 years and has applied and received funding for over 11 projects totaling over \$870,000. These projects have been completed, throughout these projects reporting back to Harwich CPC with updates and returning funds, when there has been a remaining balancing to CPC Committee. Upon completion of each project, resending before and after photos as well as full report.

8. Budget/Need for Public Funds: What is the total budget (sources of funds and uses/expenses) for the project and schedule for expenditure of CPA funds? All sources of funds and expenses must be clearly identified. Provide the basis for cost estimates whenever possible. (Note: CPA funds may not be used for maintenance.)

The total budget for both Civil & Revolutionary War Memorials was \$256,282 which was approved by the Town of Harwich May 2023 Town Meeting. The Harwich CPC requested that I go to the Brewster CPC for funding to pay for the soldiers who are buried in Brewster and will be placed on Revolutionary War Memorial. The cost for the Revolutionary War memorial is \$174,738. Brewster has 37 soldiers each at a cost of \$616 x 37 = \$22,792 in addition to placing Brewster CPC on the back of memorial total ask \$23,000.

If this is part of a larger project, what is the budget for the entire project (sources of funds and expenses/uses)?

This memorial will be placed in the Walk of Remembrance in Evergreen Cemetery in East Harwich. This is an ongoing project, and the Town has created a gift account for Veterans Memorial Circle and Walk of Remembrance. To date we have received \$48,385 from Harwich CPC for Veterans Circle of Flags, they have been procured and will be installed by October this year. We received \$256,282 for both Civil War & Revolutionary War Memorials at May 2023 Town Meeting to be installed by end of 2024. In the future we will be adding additional wars as well as a Gold Star Family Memorial.

We have already been awarded full \$174,738 for the Revolutionary War Memorial from Harwich CPC, they have requested that I submit and include Brewster in the process.

The Cemetery Department from the Town of Harwich does not have budget for project. Total budget for expenses is \$5,700.

The Harwich Cemetery Department will be doing all maintenance on the memorials and will be using Harwich Cemetery Commission Perpetual Care Account.

Why Memorialize Veterans

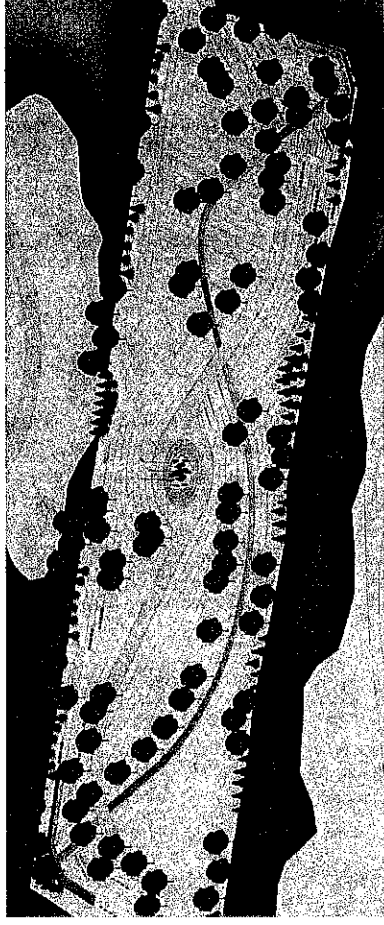
- The Revolutionary Memorial will commemorate the sacrifice and memorialize the names of individuals who went to war and particularly those who were injured or killed.

Phase I for Evergreen Veterans Park

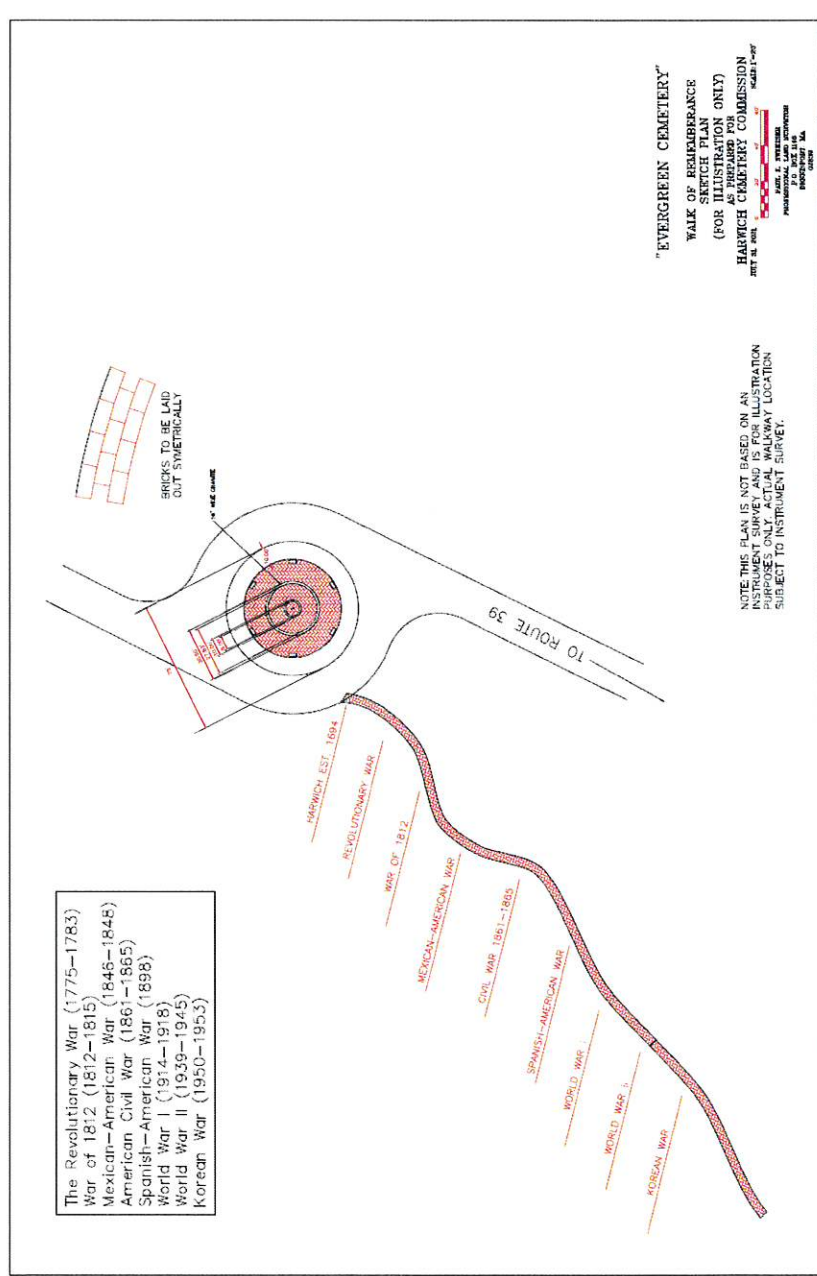
- Installation of Flag Poles & Electricity
- Installation of American Flagpole 35' and 6 Service Flags Poles 30' for each branch of the military.
 - Army, Navy, Air Force, Marines, Coast Guard and Space Force.
 - Electric Service to the Veterans Circle
 - Installation of lighting for American Flag and power to the gazebo existing electrical panel for events.



- Evergreen Cemetery contains 19 Acres and is flat and open. 7.28 acres is around the Veterans Memorial Circle.

- As areas of East Harwich continues to grow its residents are looking for safe places to walk and enjoy their surroundings. We are creating an area of remembrance for our veterans.



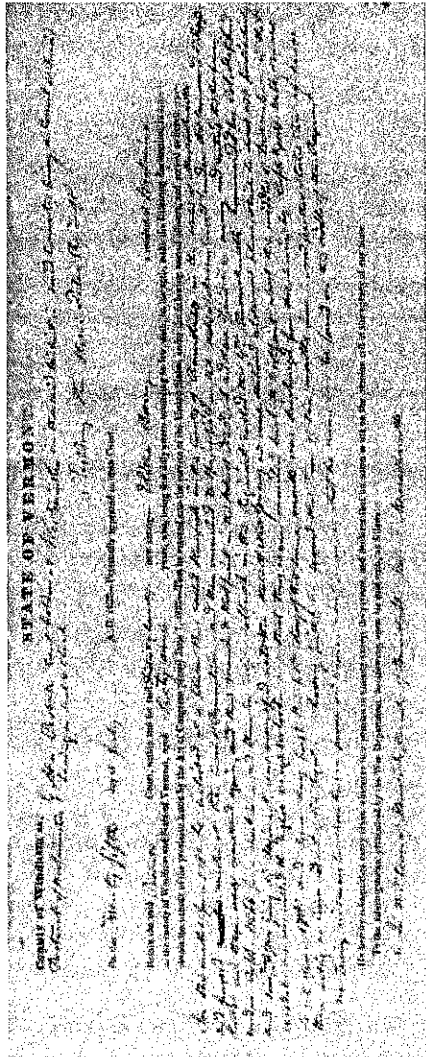
Walk of Remembrance

Revolutionary War Patriots Honored In North Harwich

HARWICH—The four patriots of the American Revolution buried in the North Harwich Cemetery were honored Saturday in a grave-marking ceremony and the placement of a bronze plaque at the corner of Main Street Extension and Depot Street.

The ceremony was conducted by the Cape Cod Chapter of the Sons of the American Revolution and included a brief oration on the deceased patriots by West Harwich resident J. Duncan Berry, governor of The Massachusetts Society, secretary general of the Order of the Founders and Patriots of America, and a member of the Cape Cod Chapter of SAR.

The patriots honored were Major William Gage (1727-1795), Sergeant Job Chase (1736-1833), Sergeant Zebulon Gage (1724-1806) and Private Gamaliel Cahoon. Several

direct descendants were in attendance to place flags at their ancestors' gravesites.

Former Cape Cod SAR president Bob Gifford led the SAR Pledge. "We descendants of the heroes of the American Revolution, who by their sacrifices, established the United States of America, reaffirm our faith in the principles of liberty, and our constitutional republic, and solemnly pledge ourselves to defend them against every foe."

Berry focused on the mercantile dynasty created by Job Chase, a West Harwich resident. Chase's wealth was instrumental in establishing a Baptist congregation in the village, and the church was a site of revolutionary fervor in Harwich, according to Berry, a descendant of two of the founder families and a descendant of one of the patriots. Chase purchased the land between the Herring River and

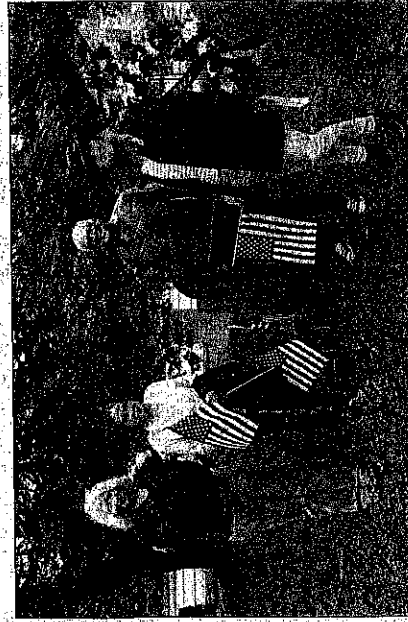

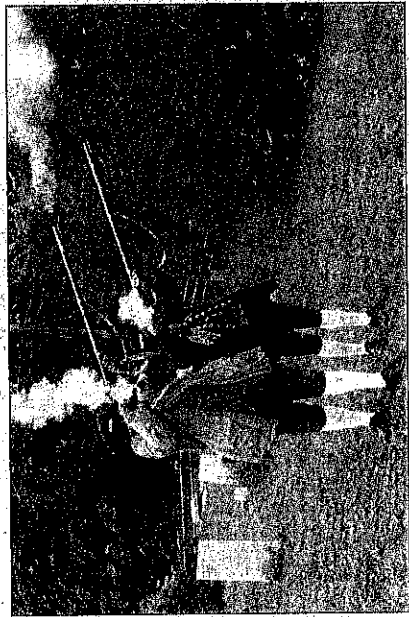

Shane will follow with his estimate for the posts, bracket, hardware and installation.

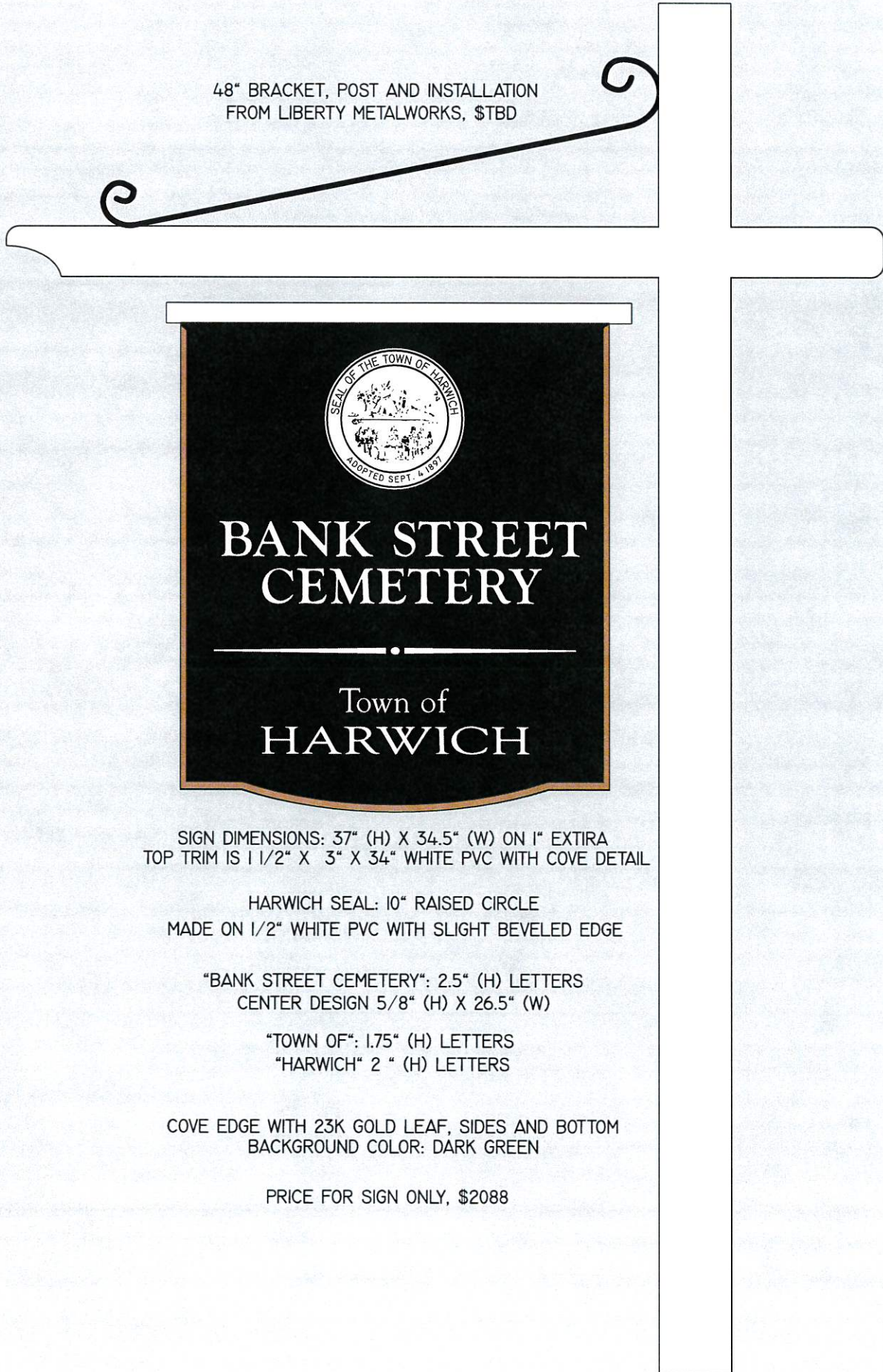

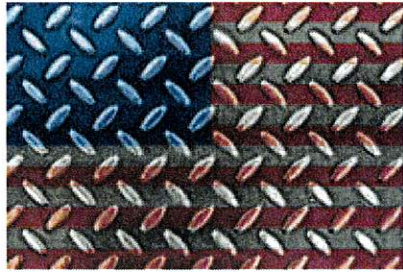

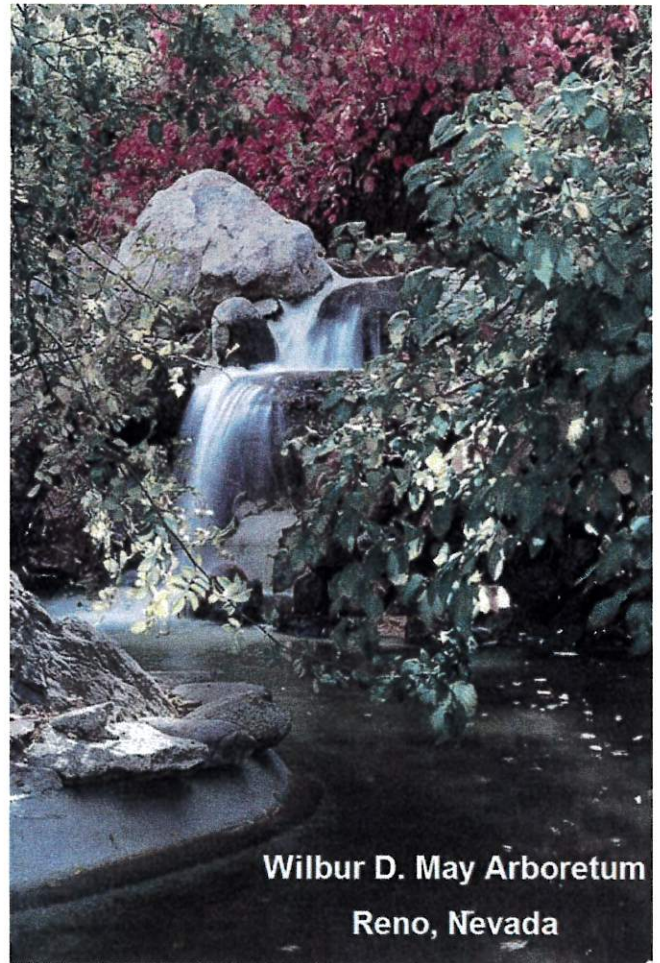
