 - 1. The purpose of the 7 **5**-year capital outlay plan shall be to provide the town with a long-range forecast of the town's major capital improvement needs and to attempt to keepdebt borrowing levels as even as possible from year to year.
 - 9-6-1 A "capital outlay" shall mean the acquisition, construction or renovation of buildings, equipment or land having a total cost of \$50,000 or more during any budget year and planning funds for any such capital outlay.
 - 9-6-2 The town administrator and the capital outlay committee shall submit a 7 **5**-yearcapital outlay plan to a joint public meeting of the board of selectmen and the finance committee during the month of December of each year.
 - 9-6-3 The board of selectmen shall prepare articles to be included in the May annual townmeeting warrant seeking adoption of the **7 5**-year capital outlay plan and funding of the current year of the plan.
 - 9-6-4 A simple majority vote of the town meeting shall be required to adopt the **7 5** year capital outlay plan as submitted. Any amendment to a previously adopted Capital Plan shall require a two-thirds vote at the Annual Town Meeting.
 - 9-6-5 If any part of the current year of the plan receives funding support at the annual town meeting, but fails at any necessary debt exclusion, capital exclusion or proposition 2 1/2 override ballot votes, the unsupported portion shall be returned to the 75-year capital plan in year 1 of the next 75-year plan, and to act fully thereon.
