Thoughts on the visit by John Crook - 3 observations

- Need to take a look at our watering patterns. There seems to be a few spots being over watered which can lead to disease growing
- Seems to be a need for a slice seeder. There seems to be a few areas in the fairways that could benefit from this
- Dry sand application to the greens to create a better root growth, maybe 2-3 times a summer

Thoughts on the visit by Martha Duffy

Martha felt it was very educational and had a lot of information on what we need to look at. Feels it's a great benefit for Mr. Fernandez in regards to all he does to make the course in the great shape that it is.

Thoughts on the visit by Roman Greer

Mr. Greer agrees with Mr. Crook in regards to the dry sand application. They are going to look into that. The Slice seeder is a great thing also. He sees the wet spots and it is concerning. It's a hard thing to be ahead of the competition in browning out your course. The number one priority he got from the visit is turf conditions around greens, turf tree removal and air flow around greens.

Mr. Johnson would like to see the posted report and have some important part highlighted for the members.

Mr. Skorulski put Cranberry Valley's name in for a USGA Case Study which would be a huge thing for the course.
