 deteriorate. He feels it should be repaired.
- Rich Larios stated that Red River Beach is the best in Harwich and inquired as to whether or not beach sticker fees could pay for the repaving.
- Angelo La Mantia said that he thinks the dozen or so potholes can be filled. He
 also thinks that half the cost could be covered by Free Cash.
- Chris Clark said that there has not been any major commitment to the Recreation Department in the last few years.
- Rich Larios discussed what the \$250,000 would cover (drainage and repaving). He said that drainage is primary, but that the safety issue is important regarding falls from potholes.
