- From Upper County Road at Route 28 to Herring River
 - Total length 0.75 miles



How did we get here?

March 2015

Town considers project visioning and potential DOT funded project

September 2015

Town of Dennis representatives attended project site walk and supported connection into Dennis **May** 2016


Town submitted project need form to MassDOT

April 2017

MassDOT Project Review Committee reviewed and approved project for funding **October** 2019

VHB completed 25% Design & Right of Way Submission





Project Goals

- Regional connectivity
 - Continue improvement of Route 28 corridor
 - Promote healthy transportation via bike & ped facilities
- Remedy the lack of consistent pedestrian facility from Dennis Port to Herring River
- Provide ADA compliant sidewalks and road crossings
- Upgrade traffic signals at Upper County Road & Division Street
- Rehabilitate roadway surface

Project Development Status

Complete

- Preliminary (25%) design & utility coordination
- Plan revisions based on preliminary design review by Towns & DOT
- Preliminary right-of-way plans
- Design Justification Workbook
- Soil borings for proposed traffic signal reconstruction


In Progress

 Revised preliminary right-of-way plans & DOT review




- New 5-foot-wide brick & asphalt sidewalk
- Updated cement concrete pedestrian curb ramps
- Reconstructed roadway 11-foot travel lanes, 5-foot shoulders
- New edge treatment primarily granite curb & Cape Cod berm
- Reconstructed traffic signal Upper County & Division Street
- Crosswalk relocations & additions
- Addition of sidewalk level lighting to Silver Street
- Landscaping
- Roadside sign updates
- Sewer, water & drainage upgrades















































Right of Way (ROW) discussion – 25% Design

- Responsible for acquiring all necessary rights in public land for design, construction, and implementation of a project.
- Affected property owners will be contacted by personnel from the ROW Bureau or consultants representing MassDOT.
- Procedures must comply with state and federal regulations governing the acquisition process.
 - Property owners are protected under Massachusetts General Laws, primarily Chapter 79.
 - If project receives federal funds, property owners are further protected under Title III of the Real Property Act of 1970, as amended.
- Fee takings, permanent easements, and/or temporary construction easements may be required.





What are the environmental and cultural resources impacts?

Environmental Permitting

- Notice of Intent Conservation filing
 - Work in vicinity of Herring River resource area
- Project does not cause any direct impacts to resource areas



Traffic Impacts

- Police details will be used to manage traffic through the work zones
- Traffic management setups will follow the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD)
- Cape summer work moratorium
 - Typical shutdown of work impacting vehicular traffic from Memorial Day to Labor Day


