

#### **PETER TRULL: Coyotes in Your Neighborhood**

Eastern coyotes, found throughout eastern North America, have a genetic make-up that can be a combination of two species of wolves, western coyotes, and domestic dogs. These wild canids thrive alongside the growing human population on Cape Cod, with its diversity of habitats, open space, and "island ecosystem." Their presence in our yards and neighborhoods may cause unnecessary alarm owing to misinformation that generates fear and anxiety.

In this talk, naturalist and HCT walk leader Peter Trull will share his knowledge and research to offer an objective view about the eastern coyotes' place in our world as well as our place in their world.

## January 13<sup>th</sup>, 1PM-2PM MARK ROBINSON: History & Future of Land Conservation on Cape Cod

Discover the history and future of land conservation on Cape Cod with Mark Robinson, long-time director of The Compact of Cape Cod Conservation Trusts, as he shares an overview of the themes that drive land protection. Early efforts began with philanthropic gifts and civic beauty efforts, and later graduated to the powerful rise of land trusts and municipal programs beginning in earnest during the 1980s.

Learn how the 21st century is projected to bring trends of "undevelopment" and ecological restoration that can return land once cleared for commercial purposes and other uses back to its natural state.





#### January 27<sup>th</sup>, 1PM-2PM RUSS COHEN: Nibbling on Native Plants in Your Backyard & Beyond

Interested in growing edible native plants in your backyard? Please join expert forager and author Russ Cohen to learn about at least two dozen species of native edible wild plants suitable for adding to your own landscape, or to forage in other locales.

Discover key identification features of each species, learn which parts of the plants are edible, the seasons of availability, preparation methods, and guidelines for safe and environmentally responsible foraging. Russ will discuss his experiences growing some of these plants from seed and the partnerships he has made with conservation groups to add edible native plants to their landscapes.

#### **Important Updates on Passport Processing**

The Department of State is committed to providing the best possible service for our passport customers.

#### We encourage all Americans to:

- Check their passport expiration date before making plans for international travel, and
- Renew their passport well in advance of international travel.

**Current Processing Times:** Processing times have returned to our pre-pandemic norm. As of December 18, 2023, passport applications will be processed within 6-8 weeks for routine service and 2-3 weeks for expedited service, which costs an additional \$60. With this update, we have fulfilled our commitment to return to benchmarks from March 2020.

Processing times begin when we receive your application at a passport agency or center, and do not include mailing times. It may take up to 2 weeks for us to receive your application after you mail it to us, and up to 2 weeks for you to receive your completed passport after we mail it to you.

**High Demand:** In 1990, only five percent of Americans had a passport. Today, that number is 48 percent. More Americans can travel abroad now than at any time in our history. There are now over 160 million valid U.S. passports in circulation (nearly double the amount from 2007).

This past year, the Department experienced unprecedented demand for passports. Between October 2022 and September 2023 (the federal fiscal year), the Department of State issued over 24 million passport books and cards - the highest amount ever in our nation's history.

**Plans to Address Workload:** We are aggressively recruiting and hiring across our passport agencies and centers. Our passport team members nationwide are working overtime each month to issue the millions of passports sought by traveling Americans.

**Contacting Us:** We encourage customers to check the status of their passport application and sign up for updates via email. Scan the QR Code here for info on getting your passport application status.

**Apply Early:** We are committed to transparency and will continue to provide regular updates about passport processing times, and to encourage Americans to apply for their passport well in advance of any planned international travel to avoid last-minute issues.



## Town of Harwich – Hall of Fame Asa Leonard Jones

Inducted May 2005

Asa Leonard Jones grew up in the Town of Harwich and was attending the Brooks Academy when the Civil War broke out. Because he had completed some schooling, he was given the rank of Sergeant in the 39<sup>th</sup> Massachusetts Volunteers where he served until September of 1863. He was then promoted to Lieutenant and assigned to the 6<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment of the United States Colored Troops. Here he served with distinction until after the war was over in 1865. After the war, Asa came back to Harwich. He served for two years on the Nantucket Light Ship between Nantucket and Monomoy, before taking the post as keeper of the Monomoy Lighthouse for 11 years. In 1875, he built the house which still stands at 44 Oak Street in Harwich. Here he lived with his family. His children attended school in Harwich.



When Asa finished his lightkeeper duties, he began a funeral home business in Harwich. He was elected to the Board of Selectmen, and was one of the first citizens in the Town to own an automobile! His descendants still live in Harwich today, and for his contributions to the fabric of this diverse community, we, the Board of Selectmen, induct Asa Leonard Jones to the Harwich Hall of Fame.
