Gardening Tips from Toni

Get to know the weeds: Mugwort

Caring for the Community Center rose garden requires constant weeding. One day I sat down and made a list of some of the weeds-more than forty and counting. One of the worst, most difficult to control is Artemesia vulgaris, (Mugwort). It spreads not only by seeds but, as you can see from this picture, by long white stolens that spread out underground forming a dense mat. The best way to remove it is with a spading fork.

Town of Harwich – Hall of Fame Eric A. Farham Inducted May 2006

Eric A. Farham was born, raised and educated in Harwich. He served his country in World War II and returned to Harwich to marry, raise a family, and conduct business until his retirement.



Mr. Farham served on the first Conservation Commission in Harwich and was instrumental in preserving the 240 acres that make up the Bells Neck-Herring

River Conservation area which was scheduled for development. Largely through his efforts, the Harwich Board of Selectmen voted to acquire the area and preserve it in its natural state for conservation and recreational use.

The Massachusetts Wildlife Federation honored Mr. Farham by naming him one of the 1966 Conservationists of the Year. In addition, he was named the National Water Conservationist by the National Wildlife Federation in 1967.

Eric Farham understood how important the issue of conservation would play in the development of the Town, and how much it added to the Town's reputation as a leader in conservation.
