JUNETEENTH

FREEDOM DAY

JUNE 19



In June of 2021, Juneteenth became our newest national holiday. It provides an invitation for all of us to join in the jubilee over the ending of slavery and that inhuman centuries-long period of American history.

Juneteenth, also known as Freedom Day or Emancipation Day, holds immense historical significance in the United States. The day commemorates June 19, 1865, when Union General Gordon Granger arrived at Galveston, Texas, and announced that all enslaved individuals in Texas were free. This event marked the effective end of slavery in the Confederate states, as it occurred more than two years after President Abraham Lincoln's Emancipation Proclamation.



The Emancipation Proclamation, issued on January 1, 1863, declared that all enslaved individuals in Confederate-held territory were to be set free. However, the news spread slowly, and enforcement varied across different regions. It was only with General Granger's arrival and the Union army's presence in Texas that the message of freedom reached the last enslaved individuals.

Juneteenth is a symbol of the long and arduous journey toward emancipation and equality for African Americans in the United States. It represents the end of one of the darkest chapters in American history—slavery—and the beginning of a new era of freedom for millions of people. The day is a poignant reminder of the struggles and sacrifices made by those who fought for the abolition of slavery and the establishment of equal rights.

Over the years, Juneteenth has evolved into a day of celebration, reflection, and education. It serves as an occasion to honor African American history, cultures, and achievements. Many communities across the United States observe Juneteenth with events, parades, concerts, and gatherings that highlight the importance of freedom, justice, and unity. In 2021, Juneteenth gained even more recognition when it was officially declared a federal holiday, emphasizing its significance in the nation's history and the ongoing pursuit of racial equality.

(1939-2005)

Robert A. Peterson served in the Air Force and as an on-call firefighter in Orleans before becoming a full-time firefighter in Harwich.

He spent 42 years with the Harwich Fire Department, over that period holding the ranks of Captain and Deputy Chief and finally Fire Chief in 1993. He was also an elected Water Commissioner, a member of the Charter Commission that brought us a new form of government in 1987, and he was elected to the Board of Selectmen in May 2004. Pete was also active in the Harwich Cranberry Festival and the Rotary Club. Robert Peterson's life was all about service to his community.

How to join a Board/Committee

1. Complete the citizen's Committee Vacancy Form found on the VIC website.
2. Meet with Selectboard Interview Committee to discuss your application, including your interests and qualifications. If the Interview Committee decides to forward your application to the full Board of Selectmen, it will be subject to a vote.
3. Upon appointment by the Selectboard, the applicant will be notified in writing by the Town Administrator's office of their appointment to the Board or Committee and the term of the appointment. You will receive a copy of the Town of Harwich Committee Handbook and be required to undergo Ethics Training offered by the Secretary of State's Office. You must be sworn in by the Town Clerk before taking any action at a meeting of the Board or Committee.

May 18th – Community Shred Event – Cars lined up for our Community Shred Event! People unloaded bags and boxes of paper that were shredded right on site.



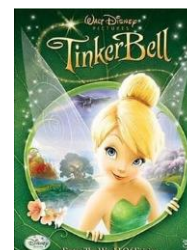
